

Partizan Belgrade | Euroleague | Adriatic League

After failing to qualify for nearly a decade, Serbian powerhouse Partizan Belgrade returned to the Euroleague this season and has managed to win 8 of the last 10 games, despite a 4-9 start.

In **The Playbook**, we explore the strategies, numbers, and personnel behind their turnaround and what is needed for a successful playoff push.

What works well

A very balanced offense


- 1st in Off Rating 121.0; 1st in 3PT% 39.4
- 1st in FG% 49.8; 3rd in PPG 84.3
 - 10 players who score between 4.2-14.9 PPG

Efficiency at the line

- 2nd in Fouls Drawn (PFD), 22.5/game
- 1st in FTM 17.2; 3rd in FTA 21

Aggressive guard play + ball security

- 6th in 2PTA 37.3; 4th in 2PTM 20.8
- 5th lowest T/O rate 11.6

What stands out

- Slow pace, but highly efficient
 - o Pace: 68.9, 5th lowest in the EL
 - PPG: 84.3 (see graph)

Quality shot selection

- o 1st in 3PT%
- 17th in 3PtA, 21.6/game

Inside approach

- o 8 of 11 rotation players take more 2-pointers than 3s
- 17th in 3ptA, 21.6

The Playbook

- Intentionally Slow Partizan's approach is designed to slow the game down, limiting possessions (for opponents) = fewer opportunities to score
- Defense Wins During the first 13 games (4-9), Partizan allowed 87.38 PPG --> last 10, 77.5 PPG
 - The Serbians have held opponents under 80 points in 7 of the last 10 games (8 wins)
- Key to Victory their offense improved slightly: 82.3 PPG/first 13 games --> 84.2 PPG last 10
 - The offense has been good, but the **defense has been great** (credit to coach Obradovic)



The Spotlight | Mathias Lessort

The 6´9 French national has been essential for Partizan's Euroleague success, and is one of the top bigs in the competition, **averaging 12.7 PPG and 7.2 RPG.**

Although a veteran in Europe (with prior stops in Red Star (Belgrade), Bayern (Munich), Maccabi (Tel-Aviv), Lessort has taken a major leap this season, earning the trust of coach Obradovic to lead the team in **MPG**, 30:57.

The Numbers

- While shooting 69%, Lessort leads Partizan and/or the Euroleague in multiple categories, including -->
- In all statistical categories, he is at least top 5 (club/league)
- Per game stats as of 2/8/23

The Exceptional

- Lessort is very active on the offensive end, excels around the rim, and knows how to position himself for easy duck-ins, putbacks, and dunks see here
- As an undersized big (6'9), he is still the team's defensive anchor, using his mobility to protect the paint
- Despite playing the most minutes for Partizan, Lessort's motor is always on high rev, and his work ethic brings fans out of their seats

Player Comparisons

Jan Vesely, 2017-18 with Fenerbahçe

- 12.5 PPG/2.5 OReb, shooting 60.9% on 2-pointers
- Excelled in the with a high motor + constant energy

Mike Batiste, 2005-06 with Panathinaikos

- 13.3 PPG /1.8 OReb, shooting 65.7% on 2-pointers
- High motor + lob threat, dominant inside the paint
